ANNUAL FUND FOR EXCELLENCE

JULY 1, 2017–JUNE 30, 2018

The Annual Fund for Excellence represents our most important whole community endeavor. Collectively for over 50 years the generous service and support of parents, faculty, staff, alumni and friends have come together in the common goal to offer the highest quality education possible for our students.

All families are contacted about the Annual Fund for Excellence with the hope that each family will participate. Our collective effort raises funds to help offset the gap between tuition and the cost of our children's education for the current school year. Tuition covers 83% of our operating budget. Inclusive of other generated revenue streams, the Annual Fund helps offset the remaining 17%.

The 2017-2018 Development Campaign focused on building our community. As such, we launched small engagement events centered on bringing Holy Trinity families together in "Circles of Conversation."

Our fundraising activities centered on the whole student and raising resources to support each student as they become their "Best You."

The 2017-2018 campaign included four Circles of Conversation community events and two key fundraising events. The fundraising events included: 1) the Annual



Fund for Excellence and 2) Sponsored Spelling. Funds raised targeted the learning needs of our students regarding enrichment activities, resources for technology, and professional development for our faculty and staff. We are so pleased to report that Holy Trinity: An Episcopal School's families and friends contributed \$86,345 to the 2017-2018 Annual Fund for Excellence. Philanthropic gifts were received by cash, check and credit card, as well as through matching employer contributions and charitable campaigns such as United Way.

The Annual Fund for Excellence facilitates a well-rounded program that includes exceptional academic courses of study, outstanding fine arts and athletic offerings, and essential professional development opportunities for faculty and staff. It also diminishes the need for withdrawals from the endowment, augments financial aid and salaries, keeps tuition affordable, and maintains an enviable student/teacher ratio.

BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY:

CIRCLES OF CONVERSATION

The Holy Trinity triangle is based upon the foundation of communication among our students, parents and school. In this effort the Board of Trustees and Head of School invited the school community to attend “Circles of Conversation” in support of our focus toward “Building Our Community.” The school year began with a school-wide Circles of Conversation event for an impactful discussion about the position of the school, the challenges ahead, and its future direction. The event featured jazz performances by our 8th grade students: Jared Jefferson, Keydra Smith-Herold, and Keyvar Smith-Herold, as well as, The Kevin Jefferson Jazz Quartet. Refreshments were provided by Chef Steven of Minute Events while wine and beverages were provided by Gourmet International Marketplace.

Three smaller more intimate Circles of Conversation events were hosted throughout the school year.

These gatherings provided the opportunity for new Holy Trinity parents to build networks with “experienced” Holy Trinity parents. Another event brought together those preparing to enter the High School Prep division with those graduating from the High School Prep division. Yet another provided parents the opportunity to build community in the same grade level. We want to thank the following families for hosting: The Hulsey Family (parents of 5th-grader Katherine); The Savage Family (parents of 8th-grader Kyle and 4th-grader Knico); and Charlene Wills (aunt of 2nd-grader Khalayah).



In our Circles of Conversation, this is where our community is most strong. Together, we empower each other to provide a network and environment that supports the development of our whole child.

SPONSORED SPELLING



Our annual Spring fundraiser, Holy Trinity's Sponsored Spelling was a great success surpassing our goal of \$25,000 by collectively raising \$26,709. The Sponsored Spelling is like a Spelling Bee except that it is completed on paper. Students received vocabulary lists assigned by their Language Arts teachers, the complexity and number of words varied by grade levels. 1st through 8th grade students with the support of their parents/guardians studied their lists to prepare for the Sponsored Spelling test held on March 23rd. Parents and students solicited their family, friends and community for sponsorship pledges. The pledge is based upon a monetary amount given for each word the student spelled correctly. Following test results, parents and/or students collected their donations.

Our community embraced technology as we launched our first crowdfunding campaign using Mobile Cause to support our outreach through social media and electronic collection of donations. Our extended communities of parents, family, friends, colleagues and the like supported our students. Students were given an incentive to raise \$250 and receive a \$75 Amazon gift card. Congratulations again to the 67 students who met or surpassed their incentives. Their study and hard work contributed to our community's success.

This has become an extremely exciting event for our students as we work together to enhance their skills in language arts and raise resources in support of their continued development.

Ms. Cheyenne Harris—6th grade, raised the most money at \$1,355. Cheyenne's grandmother always rallied to support her with pledges from family and friends for Sponsored Spelling. Unfortunately, her grandmother passed away in the Fall of 2018. In honor of her grandmother's efforts, Mr. Harris picked up the reins. Together Cheyenne and her father raised the most to support Cheyenne and her fellow classmates.
